Clinical Faculty - Important Action for Retirement Benefits

As recently announced, the COM will now create two employment/salary records for most clinical faculty who receive salary as a result of patient care activities. If you have been notified that you will be participating in this new initiative, **you will need to identify the vendor** you select for UF deposits of your employer-paid retirement contributions. Until the "Vendor Selection Form" is completed, the employer-paid retirement contributions will be remitted to a holding account.

Promotion and Tenure

The COM Promotion and Tenure Fact-Findings Committees will be restructured this year to better represent the faculty being nominated for advancement. Instead of one

committee for Associate Professors and one committee for Professors, a new Mission-Track Committee will be formed which will assess all nominees for promotion from the multi-mission or single-mission tracks or from the non-tenure accruing tracks from the previous guidelines. A second Tenure-Track Committee will assess all tenure track nominees for promotion and/or tenure. Faculty members who are interested in being considered for appointment to either of these committees should contact their Department Chair or Faculty Council.

Faculty Forward

We have now received a table of all faculty responses to open-ended questions, divided by campus. For Gainesville, the consistent messages indicate the need for better communication across the college and between individuals. Other comments recommend more transparency, better and formal mentoring, support and recognition of all faculty, improved tenure and promotion processes and consistent implementation of promotion

decisions.

These themes are not unique to UF and were discussed by all participating institutions at the August meeting of the Group on Faculty Affairs at the AAMC. Faculty and Academic Health Centers face ongoing challenges and certainty of change.

Departmental results have been distributed to each Chair for discussion at departmental meetings. We ask each Department to identify one or more actions to address the issues identified in the Faculty Forward Survey. College leadership will do the same.
